Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act, XI of 1948) -Revision of Minimum rates of wages for employment in Bleaching and dyeing — Orders - Issued.

ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above, the minimum rates of wages for employment in Bleaching and dyeing were fixed under the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948).

- 2. In the Government Order second read above, the Government constituted a committee under clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) to hold enquiries and to advise them, in the matter of revision of minimum rates of wages for the employment in Bleaching and dyeing.
- 3. The Government have carefully considered the recommendation of the Committee in the light of the remarks of the Commissioner of Labour and keeping in view of the directions of Government of India and have decided to revise the minimum rates of wages for the employment in Bleaching and dyeing. The appended Notification will accordingly be published in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u>, both in English and Tamil. APPENDIX. NOTIFICATION.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No.II(2)/LE/1411-1412/83, published at pages 210 to 211 of Part II – Section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, dated the 16th March 1983, the Governor of Tamil Nadu, after considering the advice of the Committee appointed under clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act, hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the Employment in Bleaching and Dyeing in the State of Tamil Nadu as specified in column (2) of the Schedule below, as specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) thereof.

2. This Notification shall come into force on and from the date of its publication in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette.

<u>Explanations.-</u> (1) <u>Dearness allowance.-</u> In addition to the minimum rates of basic wages fixed above, the employees shall be paid dearness allowance as indicated below:-

- (i) The dearness allowance is linked to the average Consumer Price Index for the Chennai City for the year 2000, that is 475 points (with base 1982=100) and for any further raise of every one point over and above 475 points, an increase of Rs.5.45 (Rupees five and paise forty five only) per month shall be paid as dearness allowance.
- (ii) The dearness allowance shall be calculated every year on the 1st April on the basis of the average of Consumer Price Indices of the preceding 12 months, that is from January to December.
- (iii) The first calculation of the dearness allowance shall thus be effective from the date of publication this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu</u> <u>Government Gazette</u>.
- (2) Where the same work or the work of a similar nature is performed by women, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made between men and women employees.
- (3)To arrive at daily rates of wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.
- (4)To arrive at monthly rates of wages, the daily rate of wages shall be multiplied by 30.
- (5)Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, the same shall be continued to be paid.
