NOTIFICATION.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No.II(2)/LE/597/2008, published at pages 409 and 410 of Part II-Section 2 of the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u>, dated the 10 th December 2008, the Governor of Tamil Nadu, after consultation with the Advisory Board, hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the employment in Tobacco Manufactory (Scented and Chewing Tobacco) in the State of Tamil Nadu, specified in column (2) of the Schedule below, as specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) thereof, the draft of the same having been previously published as required by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act.

2. This Notification shall come into force with effect on and from the date of its publication in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u>.

Explanations.- (1) **Dearness Allowance.-** In addition to the minimum rates of basic wages fixed above, the employees shall be paid dearness allowance as follows:-

(1) (i) The dearness allowance shall be linked to the Average Consumer Price Index Number for Chennai City for the year 2000 (that is, 475 points with base 1982 = 100) and for every rise of one point over and above 475 points, an increase of 16 paise (Sixteen Paise only) per day shall be paid as dearness allowance.

(ii) The dearness allowance shall be calculated on the first April of every year on the basis of the average of the indices of the preceding twelve months, that is, from January to December.

(iii) The first calculation shall be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u> based on the Average Consumer Price Index of the previous year (i.e. from January to December).

(2) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made in the case of men and women employees.

(3) (i) To arrive at the daily wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.

(ii) To arrive at monthly wages, the daily rate of wages shall be multiplied by 30.

(4) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, such existing wages shall be continued to be paid.
