## <u>APPENDIX</u>

## **NOTIFICATION**

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment department Notification No. II (2)/LE/3238/89, dated the 8<sup>th</sup> June 1990, , published at page 381 part- II- Section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, dated the 11<sup>th</sup> July, 1990, The Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in Bought Leaf Tea Factories in the State of Tamil Nadu specified in the corresponding entries in column (2) thereof the draft of the same having been previously published as required by clause (b) of sub-Section (1) of Section 5 of the said Act.

2. This Notification shall come into force with effect on and from the date of publication in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette.

Note: Employee who works for 4 hours or less than 4 hours during a day shall be treated as a part-time worker.

Note: The above wages for Chest Assemblers are payable for assembling minimum of 25 approved chests (ISI) or 30 8unapproved chests. For assembling more than the above number of chests Rs.1.09 and 0.88 p. shall be paid for each approved chest and unapproved chest respectively.

# Explanations:

- (1) (i) <u>Dearness allowance.</u> (i) The dearness allowance is linked to the Average consumer price Index for Madras City Center for the year 1991 i.e.1051 points (with base 1960=100) and for every rise of everyone point over and above 1051 points, an increase of 80 paise (eighty paise only) per month shall be paid as dearness allowance.
  - (ii) The dearness allowance shall be revised on the 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1<sup>st</sup> April, 1<sup>st</sup> July and 1<sup>st</sup> October of every year based on the average consumer price index of Madras City Center (with base 1960=100) for the second previous quarter beginning with the 1<sup>st</sup> July, 1<sup>st</sup> October, 1<sup>st</sup> January and 1<sup>st</sup> April respectively.
  - (iii)The first calculation shall thus be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, based on the method as prescribed above.
- (2) Where the same work or work of a similar nature is performed by women, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made as between men and women workers.
- (3) (a)To arrive at daily rate of wages, the monthly rate of wages shall be divided by 26.
- (b)To arrive at monthly rate of wages, the daily rate of wages shall be multiplied by 30.
- 4. Wherever the existing wages are higher that the minimum wages fixed herein, the same shall be continued to be paid.
